


- Project Name: North Camino Alto Open Space Preserve Habitat Restoration and Multi-use Trail Connector
- 2. Project Location: Camino Alto Open Space Preserve, Marin County
- 3. Assessor's Parcel 033-101-16, 025-261-08
- 4. Project Description:

The Marin County Open Space District is proposing a habitat restoration and multi-use trail connector project in the Camino Alto Open Space preserve. The project includes restoring coast live oak and California bay woodland habitat along approximately 2,587 linear feet of five foot wide undesignated trail. This will result in restoration of approximately 13,000 square feet of habitat.

Approximately 1,062 linear feet of new trail will be constructed at a five foot width to provide a sustainable connection between two existing undesignated trails. The final alignment of new trail will make one, sustainable multi-use connector between Escalon Fire Road and Camino Alto Fire Road, and eliminate six segments of erosive undesignated trail. The proposed project will result in a net gain of approximately 7,625 square feet of coast live oak and California bay woodland, and reduction in use of an equal amount of undesignated trail.

The Marin County Open Space District is responsible for protecting and enhancing the natural resources of its open space preserves, and providing public access to the preserves via a system of roads and trails. The District regularly implements habitat restoration projects and repairs and maintains its system of roads and trails. The project leads to the reduction of an existing use by eliminating a net of 7,625 square feet of trail, and will not result in any potentially significant environmental impacts.




