

FUELBREAK MAINTENANCE

Protecting the Community by Reducing Wildfire Risk

Marin County Open Space District will remove sprouts from invasive tree stumps - mostly Acacia and a few Eucalyptus - that were cut in 2013 when a fuelbreak was established in partnership with the Marin County Fire Department. Maintaining the fuelbreak by removing invasive woody fuels will reduce fire risk for neighbors, and it will improve habitat in the preserve. In October 2018, a contractor will cut small tree sprouts and use a chipper to dispose of the woody debris. The stumps will be carefully painted with a triclopyrbased herbicide to reduce regrowth in this high priority area.
