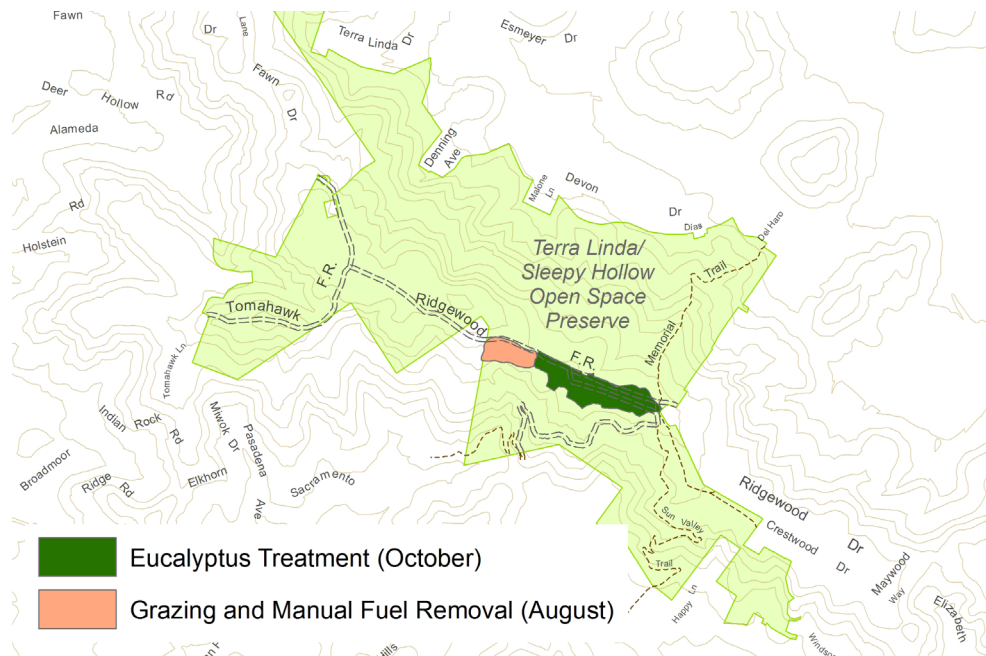

FUELBREAK MAINTENANCE

October 2018



Protecting the Community by Reducing Wildfire Risk

Marin County Open Space District will remove sprouts from invasive tree stumps - mostly Acacia and a few Eucalyptus - that were cut in 2013 when a fuelbreak was established in partnership with the Marin County Fire Department. Maintaining the fuelbreak by removing invasive woody fuels will reduce fire risk for neighbors, and it will improve habitat in the preserve.

In October 2018, staff will cut stumps that are resprouting with ladder fuels. The stumps will be carefully painted with a triclopyr-based herbicide to reduce regrowth in this high priority area.
