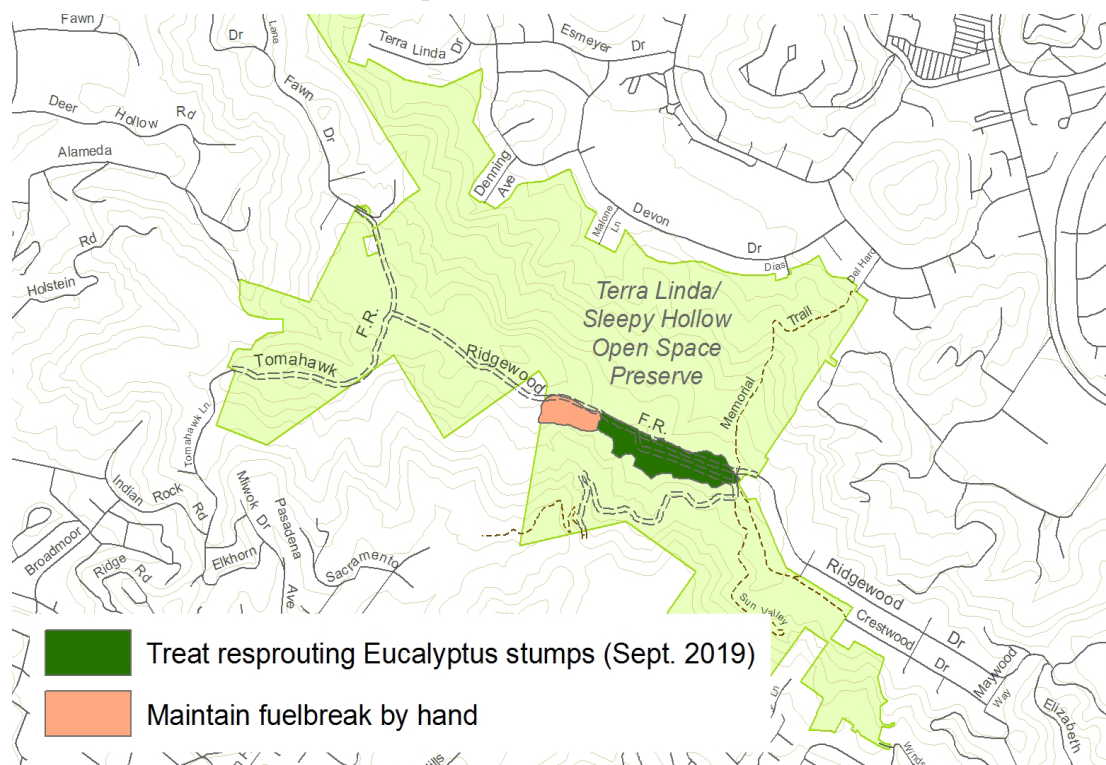

FUELBREAK MAINTENANCE

Protecting the Community by Reducing Wildfire Risk

In September 2019, Marin County Open Space District staff will remove resprouts from invasive eucalyptus tree stumps. The trees were initially cut in 2015 when a fuelbreak was established in partnership with the Marin County Fire Department. Maintaining the fuelbreak by removing ladder fuels will reduce fire risk for

neighbors, and it will improve habitat in the preserve. The few remaining stump resprouts will be carefully cut and painted with a triclopyr-based herbicide to reduce regrowth in this high priority fuelbreak area.
